## **PRELUDE**

#### CALL TO WORSHIP

Lent calls us to journey, this and every day, following Jesus wherever he leads us.

Lent calls us to journey: to the place where God covenants with us, to receive the new names we are given.

Lent calls us to worship together, to tell future generations the good news.

Lent calls us to practice justice, to bring God's hope to all people.

Lent calls us to faithful living, to trust the One who gives us life.

Lent calls each of us to take up our cross, to trust the One who bears it with us.

Lent calls us to journey with God.

Let us worship God, who walks with us, this and every day.

#### **OPENING PRAYER**

Lord of presence and power, be with us on this second step of our Lenten journey to the Cross. Help us to make a commitment of our lives, our spirits, our hearts to ministry in your name. Amen.

#### HYMN #49 The God of Abraham Praise

- 1. The God of Abraham praise, who reigns enthroned above; Ancient of everlasting days and God of love. Jehovah, great I Am, by earth and heaven confessed; I bow and bless the sacred name, forever blest.

*LENTEN CROSS CONFESSIONAL LITANY* – The Nails (If you have created a "cross" out of six candles, extinguish a second one before using the following liturgy)

We lay before the cross today the nails with which we pierced the hands and feet of God's Son. Nails are usually used for construction. We used these nails, however, for destruction. They forever symbolize our attempt to destroy God's true temple.

Lord Jesus, have mercy upon us. Forgive us for our violent rejection of your truth. Help us say "No" to destroying one another. Help us say "Yes" to the cross.

The nail-scars on Christ's hands and feet remind us of a Suffering Servant who brought redemption through his obedience unto death, even death on a cross. He let us fasten him to a cross, that we might never be separated from his love.

Lord Jesus, have mercy upon us. We cannot grasp your love that suffers for us. We often fail to love like that; we turn from the suffering of others. Help us say "No" to our self-centered nature. Help us say "Yes" to the cross.

With nails we implemented our condemnation of our Lord. They remind us of our bent to condemnation, our frequent inability to forgive ourselves and to extend forgiveness to others.

Lord Jesus, you have had mercy on us! There is now no condemnation, for you, our God, are for us. We cannot lose your love. Help us say "No" to our condemnation of others. Help us say "Yes" to the cross.

Let us pray together...

O God, whose glory it is always to have mercy: Give us your grace in our self-centeredness. Help us take up our cross and spend ourselves on a life that cannot be taken away. We thank you that nothing can separate us from your love. Transform us by that love, we pray. Amen.

# FIRST SCRIPTURE LESSON Mark 8:31-38

<sup>31</sup> Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. <sup>32</sup> He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. <sup>33</sup> But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things."

<sup>34</sup> He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. <sup>35</sup> For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. <sup>36</sup> For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? <sup>37</sup> Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? <sup>38</sup> Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels."

## SECOND SCRIPTURE LESSON Genesis 17:1-7, 15-17

When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the Lord appeared to Abram, and said to him, "I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless. <sup>2</sup> And I will make my covenant between me and you, and will make you exceedingly numerous." <sup>3</sup> Then Abram fell on his face; and God said to him, <sup>4</sup> "As for me, this is my

covenant with you: You shall be the ancestor of a multitude of nations. <sup>5</sup> No longer shall your name be Abram, but your name shall be Abraham; for I have made you the ancestor of a multitude of nations. <sup>6</sup> I will make you exceedingly fruitful; and I will make nations of you, and kings shall come from you. <sup>7</sup> I will establish my covenant between me and you, and your offspring after you throughout their generations, for an everlasting covenant, to be God to you and to your offspring after you. <sup>15</sup> God said to Abraham, "As for Sarai your wife, you shall not call her Sarai, but Sarah shall be her name. <sup>16</sup> I will bless her, and moreover I will give you a son by her. I will bless her, and she shall give rise to nations; kings of peoples shall come from her." <sup>17</sup> Then Abraham fell on his face and laughed, and said to himself, "Can a child be born to a man who is a hundred years old? Can Sarah, who is ninety years old, bear a child?"
