PRELUDE

CALL TO WORSHIP

We thought you were dead. We thought the cross was the end.

We thought that when the stone rolled over the tomb, that was it. But this is it:

the dead are living; the cross is empty; the stone is rolled, and one word describes it all:

Alleluia! Jesus is risen!

We thought you had said your final word. We thought those with the power had won.

the word breathes; the powers are defeated; the final cry was only the beginning, and one word says it all: Alleluia! Jesus is risen!

the story has just begun; the hope is newly born; the tomb is empty, and one word says it all: Alleluia! Jesus is risen!

We thought that when they crucified you, death had defeated life, and that was it. But this is it: Love is stronger than death, and one word says it all: Alleluia! Jesus is risen!

- ⁵ Out of my distress I called on the Lord; the Lord answered me and set me in a broad place.
- ⁶ With the Lord on my side I do not fear. What can mortals do to me?
- ⁷ The Lord is on my side to help me. I shall look in triumph on those who hate me.
- ¹⁵ There are glad songs of victory in the tents of the righteous: 'The right hand of the Lord does valiantly;
- the right hand of the Lord is exalted; the right hand of the Lord does valiantly.'
- ¹⁷ I shall not die, but I shall live, and recount the deeds of the Lord.
- ¹⁸ The Lord has punished me severely, but he did not give me over to death.
- ²¹ I thank you that you have answered me and have become my salvation.
- ²² The stone that the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone.
- ²³ This is the Lord's doing; it is marvelous in our eyes.
- ²⁴ This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it.

SECOND SCRIPTURE LESSON 1 Corinthians 15:12-26, 55

12 Now if Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say there is no resurrection of the dead? ¹³If there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised; ¹⁴and if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain. ¹⁵We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified of God that he raised Christ—whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised. ¹⁶For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised. ¹⁷If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. ¹⁸Then those also who have died in Christ have perished. ¹⁹If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.

20 But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died. ²¹For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead has also come through a human being; ²²for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ. ²³But each in his own order: Christ the first fruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. ²⁴Then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, after he has destroyed every ruler and every authority and power. ²⁵For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. ²⁶The last enemy to be destroyed is death. ⁵⁵ 'Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?'

GOSPEL LESSON Mark 16:1-8

When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. ²And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. ³They had been saying to one another, 'Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?' ⁴When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back. ⁵As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. ⁶But he said to them, 'Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. ⁷But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you.' ⁸So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.
