*It won't matter if your turkey is undercooked or even burnt to a crisp.*

**What matter is this – Thanksgiving can remind us that being grateful is a choice. It is an invitation that God gives to each one of us. Scripture teaches us to “Give thanks in all circumstances.”**

*Another way to understand that verse is, “Give thanks in the midst of all circumstances.”*

*What are you thankful for – not about this coming Thursday – but today? Right now. As we turn to God in gratitude, what words come to mind? Allow those words to fill your heart as you turn to worship the Lord our God.*

**Lord of bounty and blessing, we come to you this day in gratitude for all that we have been given. We are grateful for the blessings and for the opportunities to be of service to others in your holy name. Bless each of us here, that we may become truly blessings to others. For we ask this in Jesus' name. Amen.**
