## **Pastor Notes**

"Then Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. Now when the centurion, who stood facing him, saw that in this way he breathed his last, he said, 'Truly this man was God's Son!'" -- Mark 15:37-39

It's time. Just this past Monday I asked Paul W. to remove the Plexiglas partition that has been attached to the pulpit now since we moved worship inside last fall due to the pandemic. The barrier was put in place in order to protect the congregation from the possibility of my spreading the virus. Standing behind it was like being in another world apart from the congregation. Oh, the field of vision was clear, but I always noticed that there was something blocking me from everyone. It felt like I was in my own little world. I could see you, but I wasn't with you.

Maybe that's why God sent Jesus to live among us. God could see us, but as much as God communicated through the prophets, God wasn't with us, not in the way that God wanted like when God walked with us hand-in-hand in Eden. God's love for us is so great that this separation would not do. And so God took on flesh and dwelt among us – no partition, Plexiglas or otherwise.

In the gospels we hear about how at the time of Jesus' death the veil of the temple was torn in two. That "veil" is a large curtain that provides a barrier between worshipers and the center of the Temple, the Holy of Holies where God was believed to dwell, as in the throne of God. Only the High Priest was permitted entrance. It was kind of like the curtain that concealed the Wizard of Oz.

When that curtain was torn in two, nothing blocked entrance to God – not a virus, social status, heartache, or our messed up tarnished sinful selves. We are all invited and welcomed into the presence and power of God.

This is what we celebrate on Easter – God with us, not as a tiny vulnerable baby, but as a risen and all-powerful Savior. Nothing can separate us now, not even death. Halleluiah!




