CPR CLASS AT CHURCH: It's a win-win! Want to learn CPR, and donate to church at the same time? We're pleased to announce a CPR class for church members and friends. Whether you are renewing your certification, or taking a class for the first time, this 2-hour class is for you. The skills presented include CPR, use of a defibrillator, & of relief of choking in adult and in child victims. The training will prepare you to respond in an emergency that may occur at home or work, during worship or the church nursery, or in the community. The cost is \$40 per person, same as in previous years. Also, as in previous years, after the material costs are met (\$25.50 per person), the remainder will be donated to church for each attendee (\$14.50 per person). Two dates are offered: Thursday July 14 at 7PM, or Saturday July 23 at 9AM. (The classes are identical- you only need to attend one class).
