Pastor's Notes

"So they left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. Suddenly Jesus met them and said, 'Greetings!' And they came to him, took hold of his feet, and worshipped him. Then Jesus said to them, 'Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me.'" -- Matthew 28:8-10

I watched those two as they made their way and what I noticed was no real surprise – they had their gaze fixed on their phones! Even as they chatted to each other, their eyes were peeled on their hand-held devices. "Boys, you are missing it!" I thought to myself.

After traversing the walkway about half way around, they exited and I sighed. But isn't that they way of things, I thought to myself. So often we have our gaze fixed downward that we don't look up and see the beauty that is around us. It reminded me of something Sharon Ruth said during Bible study one Thursday night when she suggested that there is beauty all around us, we just have to lift our eyes to see it.

I know I am guilty of often looking down at my device – the phone, computer or TV and see the ugly images of hate, violence, greed, and injustice. We do need to look down and see those things, but that isn't the only images out there, even though at times it would seem so. There is beauty all around us, God-given beauty, the Spirit at work. These are life-giving images and all we have to do is look up and see.

This is Easter. Yes, there's a cross on the hill, but there is also an empty tomb. There were grave clothes, but there was and *is* a Savior who greets us and walks with us. Look up. Just as the flowers are blooming with life, so is the world around us. This is the risen Savior with us. We just have to see him.

Per capita is the amount constitutionally required of each church per member to enable the work of the PC(USA) on the local, synod, and General Assembly levels.




Save the Date: Wednesday May 10, Mother's Day Tea


