There is light shining in the darkness, as John says in his gospel. We need to remember that, even when the storms come our way.

Louis Armstrong is quoted as having said, "*it ain't the world that's so bad but what we're doin' to it. And all I'm saying is, see, what a wonderful world it would be if only we'd give it a chance.*"



### **STEEPLE UPDATE**



Craig Jencks has been dealing with the many complicated meetings and details for the replacement of the church steeple.

We are glad to announce major progress has been made in replacing our current steeple. Our new Steeple is currently being fabricated in Kentucky. The attic structural design for properly supporting the new Steeple has been completed. We have a signed the contract for performing all necessary pre-steeple installation work; and Buckingham Township has approved the necessary permit. In addition, obtaining a contractor to perform the necessary Lightning Protection System

hookup is currently being investigated.

The tentative removal of our existing Steeple will likely occur the second week of September with installation of the new Steeple the week of Sept 25. It will be a busy time with a lot of activity and big equipment making this event happen. It will be a moment for the entire Congregation to celebrate after supporting such a major capital improvement to our Church.

Our upgraded Carillon System will ring out in celebration!


vice monthly and for special events! Practice Date was Monday evenings last year but we may need to adjust!
