Recently I went to Philadelphia to work with The Welcome Church to distribute to the homeless the snacks that were donated by our congregation and that of Anchor Presbyterian. These were received with much appreciation. One recipient was memorable. He had opened his bag and from a distance I could see he went first for the homemade cookies. "Who made the cookies?" My immediate response to that query was "Our congregation."

Upon reflection, this seems like the correct answer. Oh, sure, some individual mixed the ingredients and baked them in the oven, but it took the congregation to make those cookies into the nourishment that they were. It wasn't all flour, sugar and eggs. It was caring, time, and faithfulness – and that took a team. Yes, someone baked, but the office administrators of both Forest Grove and Anchor put out the list of items needed. The children from Vacation Bible School packaged up the cookies along with other snacks. I distributed them along with my grandson, Keegan. The folks at The Welcome Church developed relationships with those living on the streets in that area of Philadelphia so that they were willing to accept food from strangers. Most of all, God laid it on all of our hearts to engage in this ministry following the example of Jesus.

They say it takes a whole village to raise a child. I say it takes a whole church to do the work of Jesus and I am so blessed to be a part of a church that takes that seriously. We may be a small congregation, but our work, blessed by God, has a big impact.

Yes, someone made a batch of cookies and with that and the efforts of many, we were able to distribute fifty snack bags to fifty hungry souls – hungry for more than just calories, but also hungry for the love of God that was packaged in every bag.
